What's Trending?



Apron front sinks are still going strong! Also known as farmhouse sinks, they are typically positioned slightly lower than counter height and feature an exposed front that's pulled forward. These sinks were originally designed to fit larger pots and ease the strain of having to bend over while washing dishes. Today, they have taken on many forms to fit into contemporary styling. We kept it traditional here with white porcelain, but other popular materials include copper, stainless steel, and fireclay.

Insider Tips

Stain-resistant runners and rugs are the cherry on top of any kitchen remodel. They are a great way to add interchangeable colors and patterns to your space, and they can provide a bit of cushioning when you're cooking for long periods of time. We like to source our machine-washable rugs from Ruggable!



Q&A: How to pick throw pillows for a sofa?

A: When selecting pillows for a sofa, pull the color from the largest pattern in the room (whether that's a rug, drapery, or a large piece of art). We usually have two pillows on each side of the sofa and layer one solid pillow with a patterned pillow or contrasting texture. Feel free to mix the sizes, for example, 22" x 22" as the back layer and 20" x 20" in the front. This brings a sense of dimension and creates a more custom look. In our opinion, it really doesn't matter if the solid or pattern pillow is in front, just select what you like!

Pro tip: Always use a pillow insert one size larger than the pillow cover itself for extra fullness and to hold the shape.
