What's Trending?



In 2024, many homeowners are opting to forego pendant lights over kitchen islands. This minimalist approach allows other architectural elements to shine, such as statement hoods or pendant lights in adjacent areas. This trend also works well with open floor plans, ensuring unobstructed views, cleaner lines, and a less cluttered aesthetic.

Insider Tips



Choosing suitable stools for your island ensures comfort and functionality. Ideally, the stool seat should be about 10-12 inches lower than the underside of the countertop. For standard kitchen island heights of around 36 inches, stools that are 24-26 inches high are typically comfortable. The choice between backless or stools with backs depends on your needs: backless stools tuck neatly under the counter and are great for tight spaces, while stools with backs offer more support for extended sitting periods.
